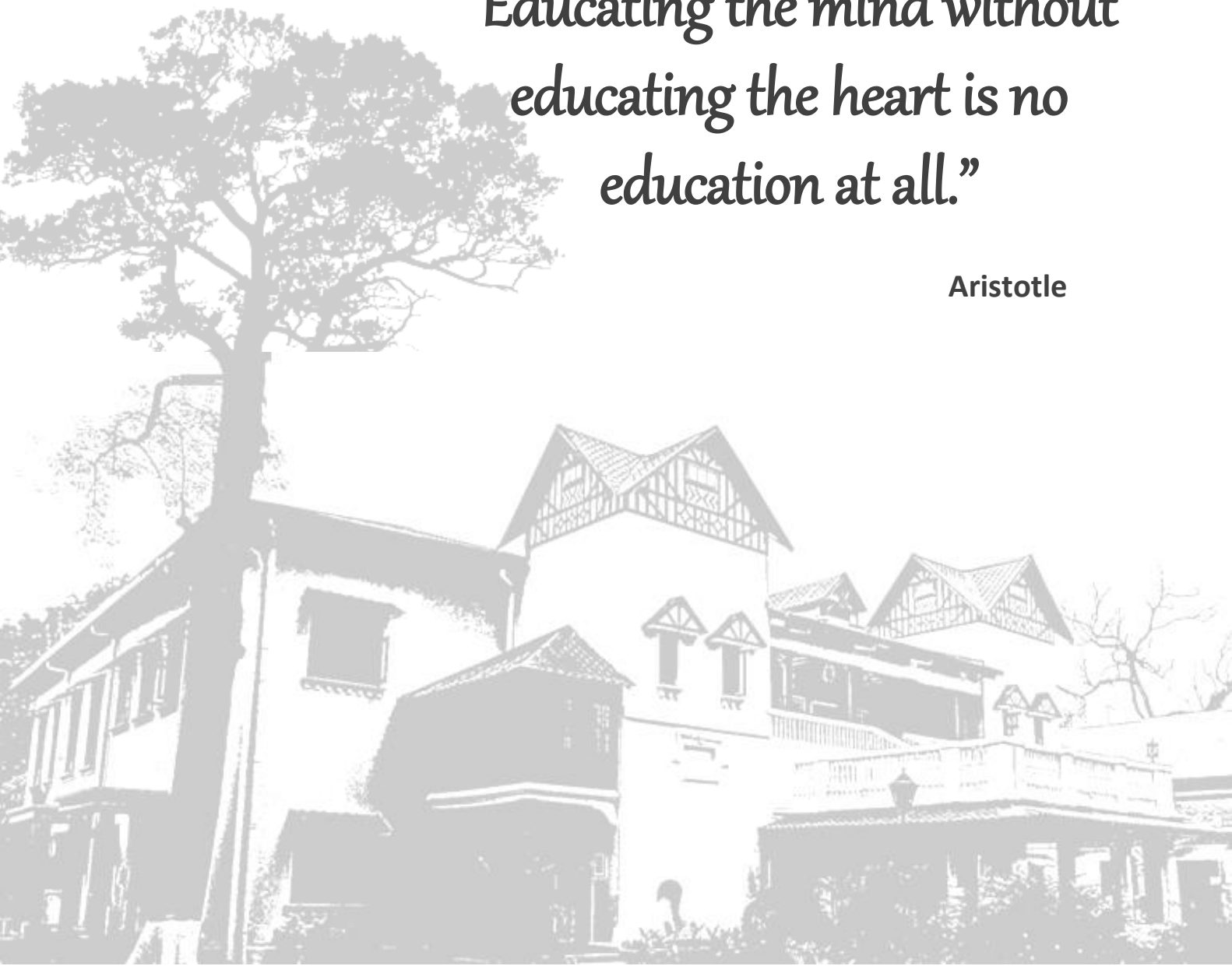

Departmental Activities

Mar'21 **Training Session by Scholastic:** An online training session was conducted on the comprehension resource, 'Short Reads' by Scholastic India Ltd. on 13th March, 2021. 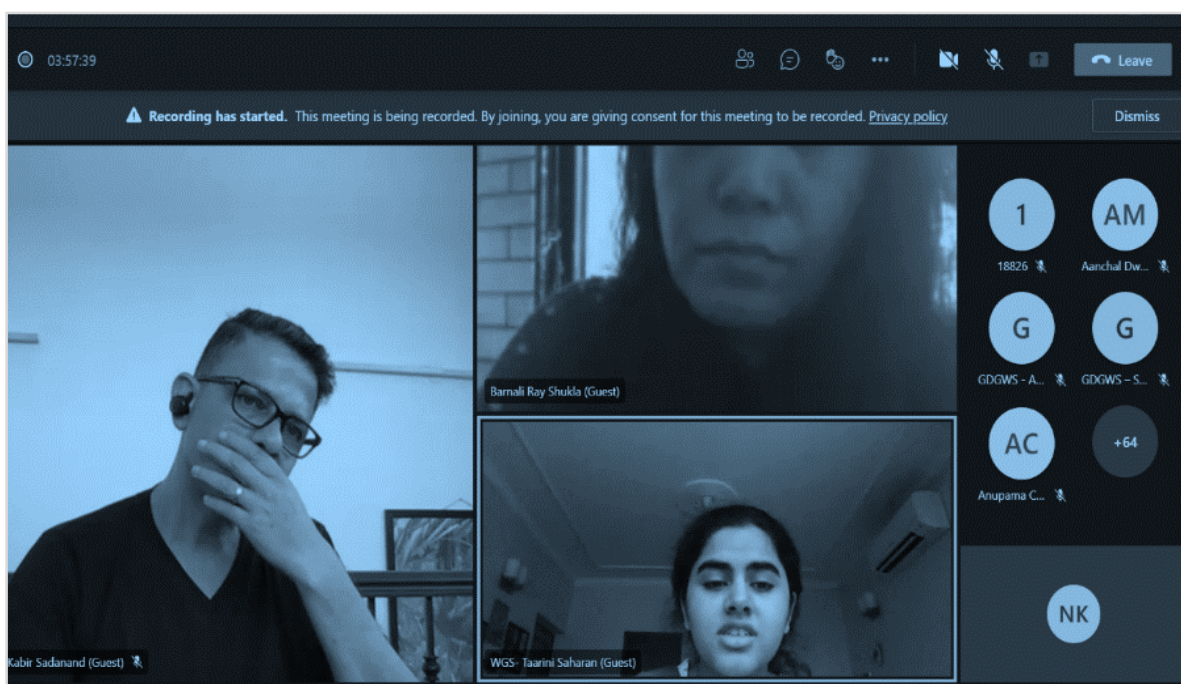

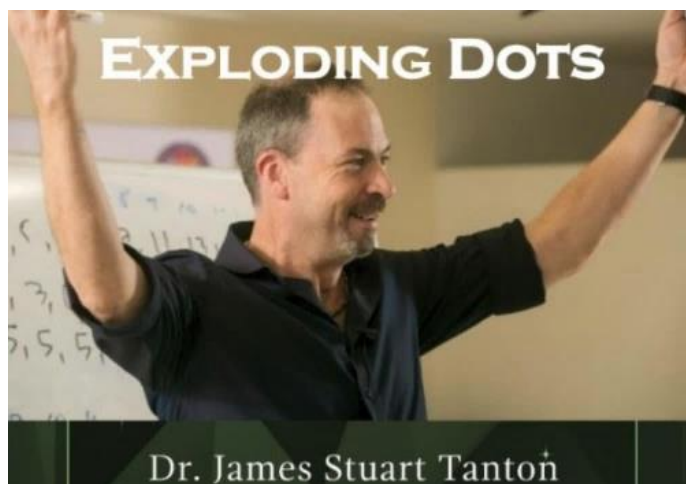

'Miss Russell Science Fair' was held online on the 17th and 18th of September. Various collaborative events were conducted during the Fair to inculcate interdisciplinary learning.

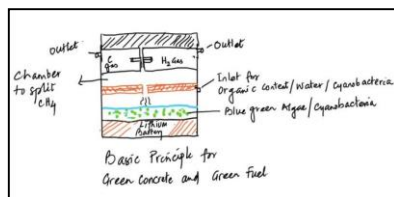

Participation in the Military History Seminar (Welham Boys' School, Dehradun)

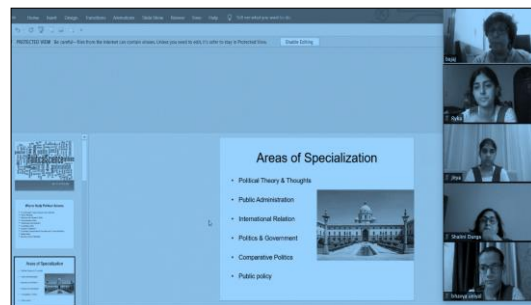

Talk on the scope of Political Science

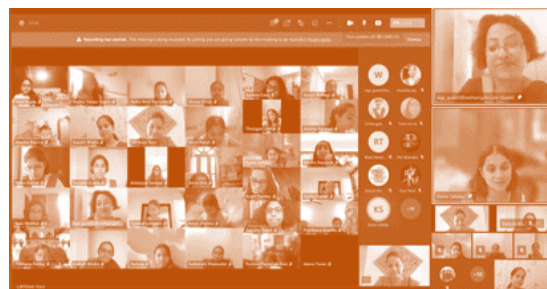

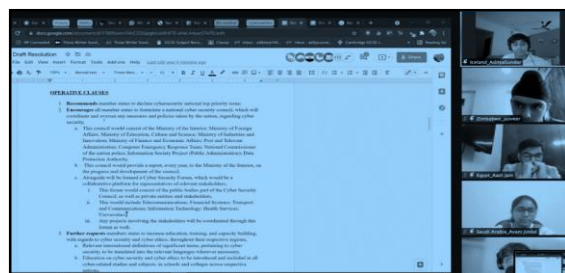

memorization of facts and figures. Students are required to work with each other on projects, where they must collaborate as a group to understand the concepts being presented to them. Through defending their positions, reframing ideas, listening to other view points and articulating their points, students gain a more complete understanding as a group than they could as individuals.

Our students made steady progress by being involved in the class activities and collaborative work which is evident from the following:

Students of Class 6 investigated features of Voter ID cards to appreciate the right to vote while learning about the importance of voting to elect people for various posts of the office of local self-governments.

They designed a poster for an action plan which could be taken up by the government for integrated waste management in a city plagued by overflowing landfills, rodents, malaria and typhoid.

They also carried out extensive investigative studies to understand the world's first cities and civilizations, their rulers, social life, occupations, form of writing, law, inventions and contributions to the world in the field of science, astronomy and architecture. They participated in exciting activities like designing imaginary civilizations, deciphering cuneiform and hieroglyphic scripts.

Class 6 students continued to explore ancient river valley civilizations comparing ancient houses with the present-day modern house designs, making models of pyramids with artifacts required by pharaohs in their afterlife. They also designed terracotta jewellery like the Harappans. They also participated in a poster making activity on Equality Vs Equity.

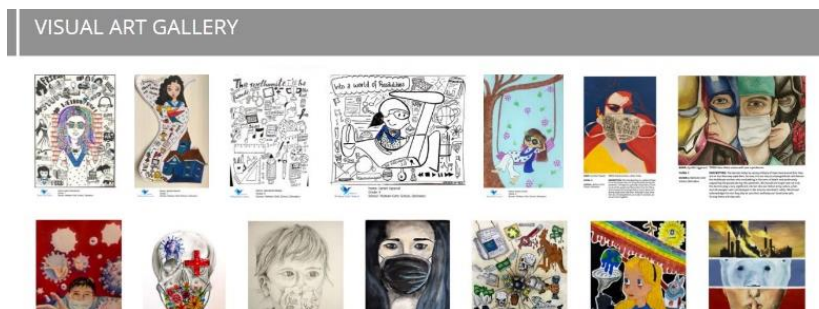

The App created by our students allows people to:

RENT: Rent out more expensive clothing reducing the costs

SELL: Buy and purchase second-hand clothing.

DONATE: Donate the clothing that is in bad condition to put them to good use.

UPCYCLE: Revamp your old clothing and sell it to express your creativity.

Our students qualified for the final stage 4 of the National Final Youth Leader competition where they presented their '**Project Redress**'. The judges applauded the exceptional work done by them.

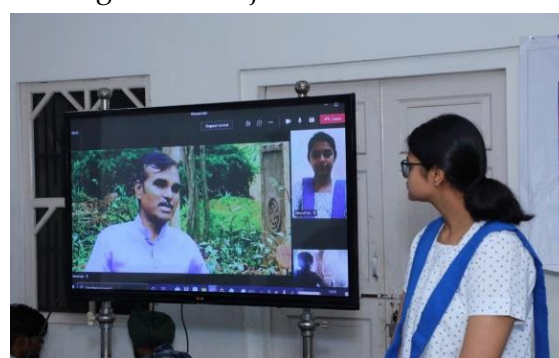

Every week, Wednesday is kept aside for SUPW and Community Service.

Owing to the unprecedented nature of the pandemic, SUPW came to a halt for Welham in 2020. However, as school opened its gates to students of classes 9, 10 and 12, in January, 2021, Welhamites received the opportunity to reinforce their strong bond with the students of **Aasraa Trust** through virtual sessions. The subjects on which the sessions were conducted included English Communication, Fireless Cooking, Computer Literacy, Dance, Music, Art and Craft, with a bonus of Aerobics. Each batch, ranging from grades 3 to 12, were taught a different subject according to its difficulty level with subjects like Art being given to class 3 and Computer Literacy to classes 10 and 12. These sessions lasted an hour, with the first 15 minutes being allotted to Aerobics, where students could warm up, and the remaining 45 minutes were dedicated to planned learning. The selected students prepared their teaching material each Wednesday with the help of their respective teachers-in-charge. They then imparted this acquired knowledge to the Aasraa students on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

The topics covered in each subject by our students were as follows:

1. English Speaking and Communication: The art of story narration, and development of communication skills with basic questions on hobbies and interests.
2. Singing: Folk Songs and Hymns (from the Geet Pustika)
3. Art: Print making (using foil and leaves)
4. Fireless Cooking: Recipes of biscuit train (using biscuits, salad and mayonnaise) and instant 'Dahi Bhalle' (using bread)
5. Computer Literacy: Introduction to Scratch, an animation software, and basic actions such as creating folders, saving files, and copy-pasting files.
6. Dance: Semi-classical 'Hori' dance, and a Holi folk dance.
7. Craft: How to make newspaper stands and flowers.


This was an enriching experience both for the students of Aasraa Trust as well as Welham. The students from Welham learnt to effectively communicate their skill sets to students who were beginners and formed a close bond with them. The students from Aasraa received the opportunity to learn something practical as well as enjoyable through these sessions.

May '21 **John Martyn Memorial School - Teach for Welham Programme:** The effort to prepare children from John Martyn Memorial School, Dehradun to be a part of Welham Girls' School continued in 2020 also. The teachers of our school assisted in tutoring the selected candidates on a regular basis. In March, 2021 two students from JMM were inducted into mainstream schooling in class 6. They had appeared for the Entrance Examination conducted in December, 2020 and cleared the written as well as practical tests. Welham has inducted eight JMM students over the last four years and has been sponsoring them.

Aug '21 **Independence Day Celebrations - 15th August, 2021:** Welham Girls' School virtually celebrated the 75th Independence Day on 15th August, 2021. The School Principal, Mrs Padmini Sambasivam hoisted the National Flag in school, and this was watched online by all the students. Renditions of patriotic songs, a short and inspiring play, Kathak dance recital, and speeches by all the Five House Captains on what freedom truly means, were telecast virtually for the staff members and the students. This was followed by a speech by the Principal, who urged everyone to celebrate the several unsung heroes who also played an active role in India's fight for freedom. She also said that we must each believe that we can make a difference to our country as an individual and ended her speech with a quote from Rabindranath Tagore's poem 'Where the mind is without fear'.

These bags and sheets are also sold during School Founders' Day celebrations and the proceeds from the sale are donated for a social cause. 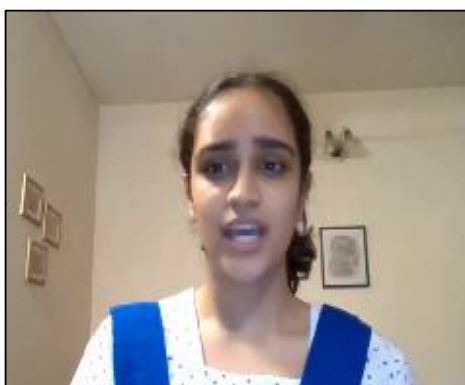
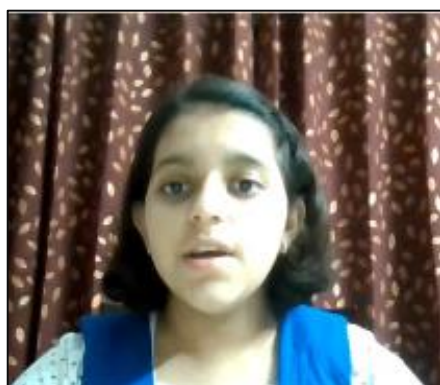

Dorm Talk- A Talk by Dr. Kirandeep Mohan:

“Dorm Talk” was initiated by two students of class 10, (B-550) Avika Mantri and (F-088) Keya Aggarwal, under the guidance of Dr. Deepti Kumar in March, 2021.

‘Dorm Talk’ aims at ensuring peer to peer bonding; creating a space suitable for guidance and advice, and encouraging the students to form opinions based on facts and figures as well as instil understanding and compassion among students. These sessions helped in addressing the many questions and confusions students have and are inhibited to ask. ‘Dorm Talk’ was conducive to inculcating a sense of warmth, comfort and free expression among students.

‘Dorm Talk’ started with Grade 8 on the 24th April, 2021. After an introductory meet with Class 8 & 9 students, House-wise sessions on **relevant topics like menstruation** were organised. Dr. Kirandeep Mohan was invited as an expert for a session with Class 8 students on 15th August, 2021. She explained the biological, mental and emotional effects of menstruation and also talked about menstrual hygiene and various menstrual products. The next series of ‘Dorm Talk’ included a session on menstruation for Class 8 students on 9th September, 2021. This session was held in collaboration with *Zephyr*, a student-led organisation working towards the spread of awareness on menstruation.

Coffee Morning sessions with Ms. Abha Kohli:

In these difficult times, the school is making every possible effort to help the parents and students through online counselling sessions. As a part of this endeavour, online counselling sessions called ‘Coffee Mornings with Parents’ were hosted on eight weekends starting from 24th July, 2021 with a trained and practising Counselling Psychologist, Ms Abha Kohli. Ms Kohli with her many years of experience in counselling children, adolescents, and adults, spoke on a wide range of issues such as anxiety, stress, conflicts, phobias, aggression, self-esteem, abuse, bereavement, and separation. Talks by Mrs Padmini Sambasivam, Principal, Welham Girls' School

Talk at National Webinar on NEP

Mrs. Padmini Sambasivam was invited to speak at the 100th session of Decoding the National Education Policy 2020 by India International Education Council (IIEC). She spoke along with India's top educationists and expressed her opinion of NEP. Mrs Sambasivam called the policy a welcome change and a shift from 'one fit for all' pattern of the current education system. She said the vision was based on lofty ideals and that one must be open to welcoming a policy that will allow all stakeholders to move towards progressive learning.

Talk at Round Square International Webinar

Mrs. Padmini Sambasivam spoke at the international webinar organized by Round Square on 4th February, 2021. The topic for her talk was “Wellness of the School Community.”

She shared a presentation on how Welham Girls' School saw the Covid-19 pandemic as an opportunity to upgrade the skills and move to a virtual platform. She further shared that the school planned the curriculum and extra-curricular activities in a way that it touched all aspects of learning for the students. The school also laid special emphasis on the physical and mental wellbeing of all stakeholders – students, teachers as well as parents, and continuously engaged in counselling and mentoring to ensure that all were able to deal with the stress and adapt to the new normal easily.

Talk at seminar by Principals Progressive Schools' Association

Mrs. Padmini Sambasivam, Welham Girls' School, was invited to speak at the National Conference of Principals Progressive Schools' Association (PPSA) on 12th February, 2021, organised by Pestle Weed College, Dehradun, on 'Use of Technology in Education post Covid-19'. She spoke on how technology would drive the education sector post Covid-19.



Mrs Sambasivam said that Covid-19 introduced teachers to virtual learning and shared how technology can be integrated with education to open a world of possibilities. She talked about Virtual Reality, Augmented Reality, Artificial Intelligence, Chatbots, Biometric and Facial Recognition tools that can take learning several notches higher. However, she said that as much as technology may seem like consuming or obliterating the value of a teacher, the role of teachers is what lends spirit to education. She opined that the presence of a teacher and the humane relationship that they build is of paramount importance for nurturing young minds into wholesome individuals.

Speaker at national debate on Mensuration Cycle

Mrs Sambasivam was invited to speak on **Period of Pride, Ek Swachh Soch** – a nationwide campaign by **Network18** and **Procter & Gamble Whisper**, called for an **escalated menstrual health awareness and education** in all schools.

She spoke on the various ways by which this very personal and emotional topic was addressed and given priority at Welham.

Teacher Development: Workshops and Training Sessions

- Dec'20** Ms. Neena Agarwal and Ms. Sugandha Shringari, from the Department of Mathematics, successfully completed three certificate courses organized by the *Government of India* under the **National Initiative for School Heads' and Teachers' Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA) Scheme**. These sessions were specially designed for CISCE and NCERT affiliated school teachers teaching classes VI to VIII. 1. **Addition/Alteration of Junior Girls Hostel in No.12 Campus:** The entire project accommodating five houses and matron residences with state-of-the-art facilities has been planned for complete renovation under two phases. 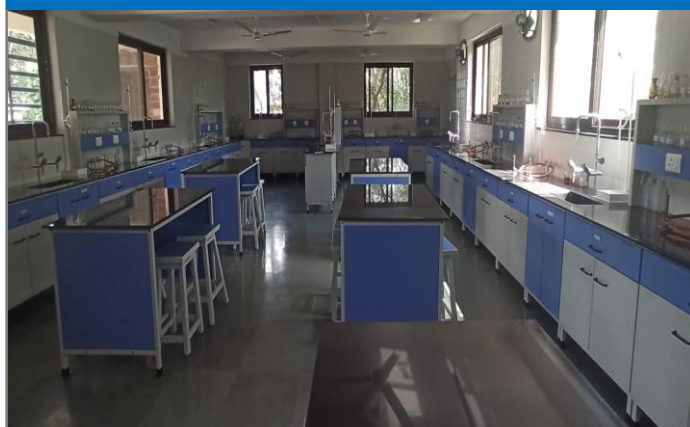
